



# CITY OF HARRISBURG TOP 8 RECYCLING & TRASH ISSUES



## DIAPERS

Diapers are trash. Keep diapers out of recycling barrels.



## FOOD & FOOD WRAPPERS

Food and food wrappers are trash.



## WHITE FOAM CUPS

All white foam plastic drinking cups are trash.



## TRASH

All trash needs to be in closed plastic trash bags, especially food waste. Clean trash carts do not attract pests.



## PLASTIC GROCERY BAGS

Plastic grocery bags are not to be put in your recycling barrel. Plastic bags should either be recycled at your grocery store or put in with the trash.



## TIRES

Tires should be taken to any tire retail store or the Susquehanna Resource Management Complex (the Incinerator). A fee of up to \$3.00 will be charged per car tire. Elderly or infirm residents should call the Harrisburg Department of Public Works for assistance with tires: 717-412-4320.



## OLD TELEVISIONS

Please take old TVs to the Dauphin County Recycling Center at 1625 South Cameron Street, along with any other unwanted home electronics. The county will dispose of the items correctly FREE OF CHARGE. Do not put TVs outside your home, or anywhere else where trash does not belong. Elderly or infirm residents should call the Harrisburg Department of Public Works for assistance with TVs: 717-412-4320.

# CITY OF HARRISBURG RECYCLING GUIDE

## RECYCLE THESE :

(Please rinse all food containers)

**Cartons:** milk, wine, soup, juice boxes (please rinse and crush, remove straws)

**Plastic Bottles**—please remove lids, caps

**Plastic food containers**, labeled with numbers 1 through 7

**Yogurt, cottage cheese, margarine tubs**

**Aluminum cans and bottles** (please crush to make more room)

**Tin cans** (please rinse)

**Paper:**

- cereal and similar food boxes (please remove liners)
- paper packaging
- copier paper (any color)
- newspaper
- phonebooks
- magazines and catalogs
- advertising mail
- paper egg cartons
- cardboard boxes (Please remove all packing materia from cardboard boxes, unless it's made of paper. If you have large or numerous boxes, please flatten them out and tie them together.)
- paperback books (to recycle hard-cover books, remove the cover (place in trash) and recycle the pages.

**STAPLES, PAPER CLIPS & RUBBER BANDS DO NOT NEED TO BE REMOVED FROM THE PAPER.**

Please put shredded paper in the trash.

## PLEASE THROW THESE IN THE TRASH:

- All GLASS that is not bottles and jars (see below)
- Ceramics (china, mugs, clay pots)
- Diapers
- Food waste and all food wrappers, plastic and paper.
- Any paper or plastic that is wet or staine with food.
- Tissue paper (napkins, paper towels, etc.)
- Shipping or padded envelopes
- Shredded paper
- All plastic packaging material (foam peanuts, bubble wrap)
- Wax-coated cardboard (usually bulk food packaging)
- Old Aluminum foil
- Clothing hangers (offer these to your drycleaner)
- Plastic tableware--knives, forks and spoons
- Paper or plastic plates, bowls and cups
- Light bulbs of all types
- Christmas lights, extension cords
- Garden hoses
- Plastic bags—these can go in the trash, but most area grocery stores have recycling bins for clean, dry plastic bags

- Kline Plaza
- Broad Street Market (Sayford & Fulton Street)
- Firehouse at 6th & Muench Streets
- Firehouse at 16th & State Streets

- Hall Manor: Carts next to the administration building at the cul-de-sac at 17th & Hanover Streets
- William Howard Day (Smith) Homes: Carts in front of the administration building
- Shipoke: under the railroad bridge near the Passage to India Restaurant

## RECICLE ESTOS :

(por favor enjuague todos los recipientes de comida)

**Cartones:** leche, vino, sopa, cajas de jugo (por favor enjuague y aplaste, retire pajitas)

**Botellas de plástico**—retire las tapas y las tapas

**Envases de plástico para alimentos**, etiquetados con los números del 1 al 7

**Yogurt, requesón, tarrinas de margarina**

**Latas de aluminio y botellas** (aplastar para hacer más espacio)

**Latas de lata** (aclamar)

**Papel:**

- cereales y cajas de alimentos similares (retire los revestimientos)
- embalajes de papel
- papel de fotocopiadora (cualquier color)
- periódico
- guías telefónicas
- revistas y catálogos
- publicidad de correo
- cartones de huevos de papel
- cajas de cartón Retire todo el material de embalaje de las cajas de cartón, a menos que esté hecho de papel. Si tiene cajas grandes o numerosas, aplastelas y atelas.
- libros de bolsillo (para reciclar libros de tapa dura, quitar la tapa (colocar en la basura) y reciclar las páginas.

**GRAPAS, CLIPS DE PAPEL y BANDAS DE GOMA NO NECESITAN SER RETIRADAS DEL PAPEL.**

Por favor, pon el papel picado en la basura.

## POR FAVOR, TIRA ESTOS EN LA BASURA:

- Todos los VIDRIOS que no sean botellas ni frascos (vea abajo)
- Cerámica (porcelana, tazas, vasijas de barro)
- Pañales
- Desperdicio de alimentos y todas las envolturas de alimentos, plástico y papel.
- Cualquier papel o plástico mojado o manchado con comida.
- Papel tisú (servilletas, toallas de papel, etc.)
- Envíos o sobres acolchados
- Papel en trizas
- Todo el material de embalaje de plástico (cacahue es de espuma, plástico de burbujas)
- Cartón recubierto de cera (generalmente embalaje de alimentos a granel)
- Papel de aluminio viejo
- Colgadores de ropa (ofrézcalos a su tintorería)
- Vajilla de plástico: cuchillos, tenedores y cucharas
- Platos, tazones y vasos de papel o plástico
- Bombillas de luz de todo tipo
- Luces de Navidad, cables de extensión
- Mangueras de jardín
- Bolsas de plástico: pueden ir a la basura, pero la mayoría de las tiendas de comestibles del área tienen recipientes de reciclaje para bolsas de plástico limpias y secas.

May, 2018: A new glass recycling effort (bottles and jars only)

Every ton of glass bottles and jars recycled with our new program saves the city \$190. Every resident who can deposit a few bottles in our containers will be helping.

Please recycle GLASS Bottles & Jars by taking them to one the **new drop-off points** in the city:

- **Uptown Plaza** (look for the light blue dumpster next to the other recycling bins on N 7th Street)
- **Kline Plaza** (look for the light blue dumpster in the rear parking lot of the plaza)
- **Broad Street Market** (Sayford & Fulton Street parking lot)
- **Firehouse at 6th & Muench Streets** (3 carts behind the building)
- **Firehouse at 16th & State Streets** (3 carts behind the building)
- **Firehouse at No. 9 South 13th Street** (1 cart behind the building)
- **Hall Manor** (carts next to the administration building at the cul-de-sac at 17th & Hanover Street)
- **William Howard Day (Smith) Homes** (carts in front of the administration building)
- **Shipoke** (2 carts under the railroad bridge near the Passage to India restaurant)

\*Federal EPA regulations require the proper removal of all CFCs and Other Ozone Depleting Substances from small appliances and motor vehicle air conditioners as well as certification that this action has taken place prior to their entering the recycling stream.

As a convenience to our customers, for scrap appliances, CSR will pay the customer for the scrap value of the appliance less a refrigerant removal cost.
